

Five themes emerged from the compiled responses. Because some responses fall into more than one theme, readers may notice that some charts appear more than once.






2. Things I want to Maintain (first and second choices, weighted)








8. I hope the following activities will be most important to my community in 25 years (1st and 2nd choices, weighted)




11. How important is access to subsistence resources to you today (N=571)




12. How important is it that 25 years from now residents have access to subsistence resources? (N=552)




8. Most important activity in 25 years (students' 1st and second choices, weighted) (N=224)




11. How important is access to subsistence resources to you today (students) (N=217)



12. How much of your family's diet comes from subsistence foods? (students) (N=223)




13. How much of your family's diet comes from subsistence foods? (N=511)




4. Things I would like to change about my community (1st and 2nd choices, weighted)




4. Things I would change (students' 1st and 2nd choices, weighted)


10. What is the most important way education should prepare youth in this community for their lives? (N=568)








21. Because I am concerned about high energy costs, I support (N=554)




22. Because I am concerned about high transportation costs and safety, I support (N=533)



19. How concerned are you about being able to secure supportive care for your family in the future? (N=490)




20. What is the most important strategy the housing authority should use to keep the program working? (N=510)


10. What is the most important way education should prepare youth in this community for their lives? (N=568)






14. I or someone in my family works in commercial fishing (N=557)




15. If our kids are going to be active in commercial fishing, the most important strategy is to increase our local access to limited entry permits (N=550)




18. What prevents local development projects here? (N=540)




17. In ten years, I want my cash income to come from (1st and 2nd choices, weighted)




21. Because I am concerned about high energy costs, I support (N=554)




26. What do you want in the future as the basis of economic development in the Bristol Bay Region? (N=460)




17. In ten years, I want my cash income to come from (students' 1st and 2nd choice, weighted) (N=186)




23. When I think about any kind of new, large development, I am most concerned about (1st and 2nd choices, weighted)



24. When I think about any kind of new, large development, I get most excited about (N=509)




26. What do you want in the future as the basis of economic development in the Bristol Bay Region? (students) (N=219)





8. Most important activity in 25 years (students' 1st and second choices, weighted) (N=224)




